

Training Day for Liturgical Visitors

Saturday, September 13, 2014

During the past decade, the Philadelphia Liturgical Institute has trained teams of liturgical visitors. The teams responded to invitations from local churches seeking help in assessing their own experience of worship, especially for the newcomer. These three person teams, each from a different liturgical tradition - for instance, a Lutheran, a Presbyterian and a Catholic visiting an Episcopal congregation - have visited a variety of churches in the Delaware Valley, with positive results for these congregations.

We are renewing this program and are seeking volunteers from all Christian traditions, who will be willing to be trained and be available on Sunday mornings to visit congregations who invite the observations and encouragement of these liturgical visitors.

We'll explore what makes for a good liturgy; what visitors do during a visit; and the logistics of setting up a visit, making observations, and continuing the conversation with the host congregation.
